
Parent / carer Survey Feedback

At the end of Term 1 parents/ carers were invited to complete a survey. The aim of the survey was to get a better understanding of the technology situation in households.


We were keen to gauge how our community has been affected by unemployment and job insecurity.

There was also a focus on identifying the areas the school is doing well and areas that require improvement. Thank You to those 104 parents/carers who completed the survey.

Of those that responded: Nearly 1/6th do not have internet access or the access is poor.



Nearly ¼ have 4 or more people working or studying from home




33% report their children have shared access to a device.

In the household just over half (51.5) reported a reduced income due to COVID-19

64.1% have had someone in their household become unemployed as a result of COVID-19

When asked what the school was doing well, the overwhelming response was Communication (56 references) and Wellbeing (29 references) with comments also referring to the school leadership, how the school is engaging and connecting with parents and students. Another focus was on how responsive the school to parent/student questions and concerns.



Areas for improvement centred on the need for more support to understand the systems in place and suggestions about what the school could look to do in future with online learning. All suggestions will be considered carefully.

Blue Fringe Arts 2020 Opportunity

Blue Fringe Arts is an art and literature festival for people with a lived experience of mental health concerns. The festival accepts entries from anyone in the community including young people high school aged. Participants can enter one piece in each of the categories Art, Sculpture, Photography, Textile and in the Literature section they can enter a Poem or Short Story. Last year Katoomba High School had a number



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of students enter and receive recognition of their work. Art entries close October 15th and literature entries close September 7th. 
KHS P&C


Zoom in for University Applications for Year 12
