Science Week at Katoomba High School

The school theme of National Science Week 2020 is Deep Blue: innovations for the future of our oceans". With this in mind. the Science faculty embraced this theme by spending a lesson learning about innovative technologies, such as the 'Seabin Project' designed by two Australian entrepreneurs. Initiatives such the 'Plastic Bank' as are changing lives and improving the environment through sustainability in Indonesia and Haiti.

Students examined an article published in the Blue Mountains Gazette in April this year, titled 'Microplastics found in the Antarctic Sea ice'. Following this. students conducted а practical investigation involving filtration and microscopy. The aim was to investigate the plastics from our polyester and nylon clothing commonly shed into the environment and our waterways when put through the washing machine.

KOALA appreciation For 12 months at Katoomba High School, a KOALA sensor

(Knowing Our Ambient Local Air Quality) has been used by students who acted as Citizen Scientists. Students maintained the device and recorded the air quality data in the mountains. The Katoomba High School KOALA was particularly useful 2019-2020 during the fire season for people to obtain accurate and timely information about the air quality. The school has been awarded a certificate of appreciation from the Blue Mountains and Lithgow Air Watch (Air Watch) Project Steering Committee. The Air Watch Winter, Spring, Summer and Autumn seasonal reports finalised have been and published on the EPA website. The data shows that air quality within the Blue Mountains and Lithgow area is generally of good quality outside of natural events such as bushfire and dust storms.
